  - The current method needs to be reconsidered?

### Introduction

- ☐ The Course Textbook Reference Collection has annually prepared for HWCOM programs based on the course textbook lists from each program coordinator
- ☐ Librarians are always required to first look for textbooks in an electronic format
  - HWCOM Library = Nearly 100% digital
  - Limited space for print copies
  - Clinical teaching sites across the South Florida region



However, searching a specific e-book title is challenging

A review and analysis of e-textbook acquisition activity records from the past two academic years (2017-2018 and 2018-2019)

### Discussion

☐ Why the individual e-textbook titles could not be obtained?

- Part of large e-book packages with other books the HWCOM Library did not need
  - → often cost prohibitive
- Single users only (no sale to library)
- Sale only through content partnerships
- Developed their own knowledge portals no more individual e-book title sales
- Print only

Medical Library

- → included the titles for which no updated edition released on the market for more than 10 years
- Per-user pricing (with or without a volume discount) (e.g., VitalSource<sup>\*</sup>)
- □ 2018-2019 --- Out-of-print titles are included (MD Period 4)
